A green-yellow to yellow-white belly

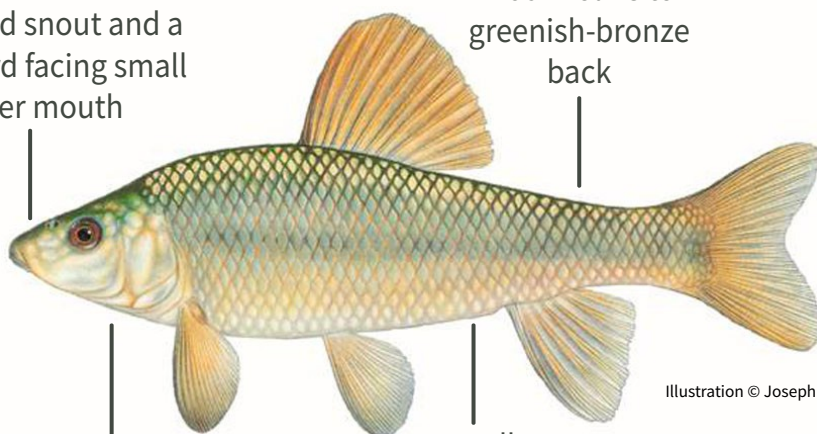
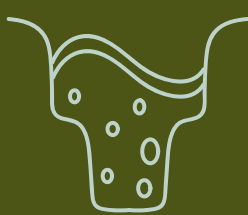
