

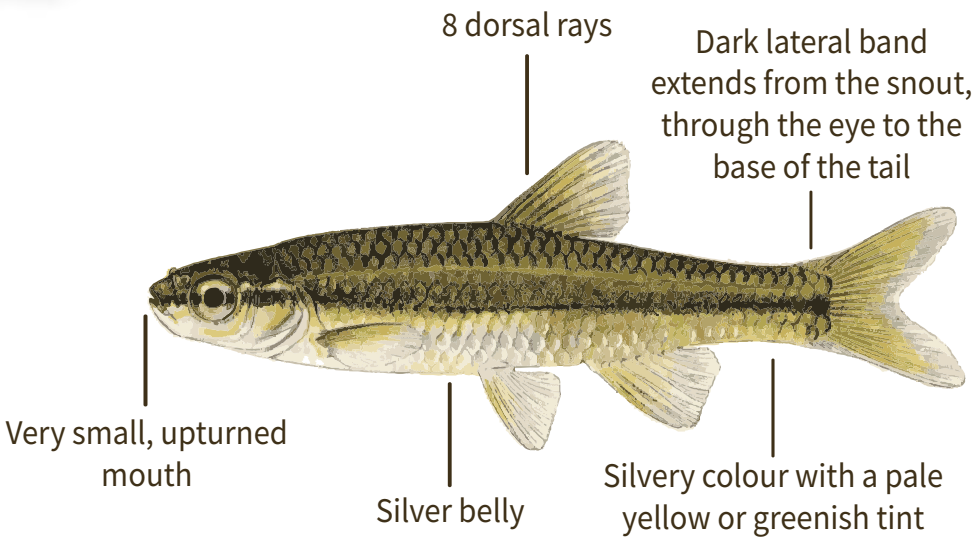

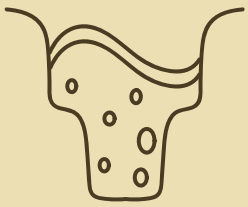

The species was known historically from Point Pelee National Park and Rondeau Bay (Lake Erie), and the Gananoque River (St. Lawrence River tributary).

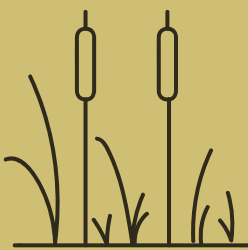
