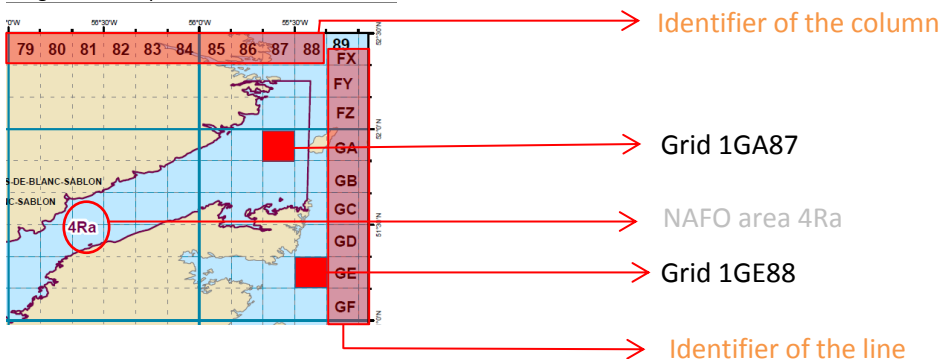


# Maps of grids

These maps are subdivided in squares called « grids ». Dependings on the map, grids may be ten minutes by ten minutes or two minutes by two minutes in latitude and longitude.

Each grid is identified this way: (Map number)(identifier of the line)(identifier of the column). E.g. 1GA87, 3LM11

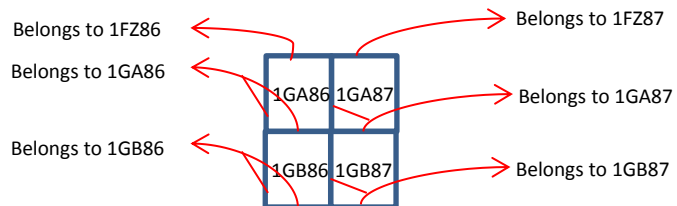
Fragment of map 1:



## Rules for grid limits:

- left limit of the grid (longitude) belongs to the grid.
- lower limit of the grid (latitude) belongs to the grid.
- right limit of the grid (longitude) belongs to the grid located immediately to the right.
- upper limit of the grid (latitude) belongs to the grid located immediately above.

E.g.:



The list of grids may be found in table MV\_GRID of the electronic logbook system (ELOG). This table contains the list of grids of map 1, 3 and 4.

Map 1 is used in most fisheries in eastern Canada (squares of ten minutes by ten minutes)  
 Map 3 is used for toad crab fishing in Magdalen Islands (squares of two minutes by two minutes)  
 Map 4 is used for lobster fishing in Magdalen Islands (squares of two minutes by two minutes)

Fact sheets will identify which map should be used in each fishery.
